

World Water Day celebrated in different parts of State

ITANAGAR, Mar 22: A poster-making competition for classes 6-12 students was held at the science centre innovation hub on Wednesday to commemorate World Water Day.

The competition was organized by the Arunachal Pradesh Science Centre, IG Park Itanagar, and NGOs Abrol Memorial Multi-purpose Society and Youth Mission for Clean River.

Education Assistant Gopi Yangda stressed the significance of water in his address by stating that it is "considered to be one of the vital components of everyone's life."

"International Water Day is therefore observed on March 22 every year to recognize the significance of water in our lives. The day increases public awareness of the value of fresh water," he added.

Supplementing this, Mission Clean Yamgom Assistant Coordinator Keyom Doni said 'awareness campaign should be started which should not only focus on water-related problems but also propagate ways to save water.'

Villagers join hands to save Lingka from erosion

RUKSIN, Mar 22: The villagers of Lingka village in East Siang district have initiated fresh anti-erosion measures in order to protect their village and fertile cropland from the grip of the Sille River.

The youths of the village erected spurs using locally available cane, bamboo and grasses to control the flow of waters on its right bank

near Lingka village and left side of Poba Reserve. But, the effort of the local villagers went in vain as high tides of the river washed away the spurs and erosion is continuing.

The river has damaged several acres of land but no effective anti-erosion measure has been initiated by the villagers so far.

According to the village secretary Sagge Gade, the Sille River is now only 100 meters away from the vil-

lage. Seeing the grim situation, the village authority has requested the job holders, PRIs members of the village to contribute as per their means to save their own village from further erosion. He informed that due to continued collection of natural resources from the river such a situation had arisen. Every year the quarry owners used hundreds of JCBs, trucks to extract stones, sand and sand gravels from the river.

Stating that child abuse was a matter of great concern, the DC added, "In

most cases, child abusers manage to get away due to the loopholes in the system. Thus, victims are either compromised or culprits are released due to the shortage of evidence. He also said that life's learning is a never ending process and those who have the power should implement what is learnt to save and protect the lives of children as these children reflect our future and are also our great resources."

The programme was



organised by East Siang District Child Protection Unit, Women & Child development Department at the DC's Conference hall, Pasighat.

In the programme three resource persons namely

Advocate Knagkiling Doso, Advocate Sunny Tayeng and Advocate Denzing Sonuwal created awareness regarding Amendment Act, 2021, Arunachal Juvenile Justice Rules 2020 and Ju-

nile Justice Model Amendment Rules, 2022, Amendment Act, 2019, POCSO Rules 2020 and Adoption regulation under Mission Vatsalya.

"Participation of people itself is a contribution to uplift the society on a better path. Thus, it is everyone's duty to protect helpless people, children survivors from sexual abuse, abusive and other offensive behaviour and give them natural justice," Advocate Tayeng, added.

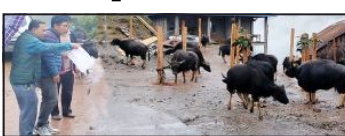
